

## CITY OF AVEIRO

The city of Aveiro dates back to the 10th Century (at least). Its name derives from the Latin Aviarium, which literally means “the gathering place of birds”. The Moors invaded and occupied Aveiro until the 11th century, after which it became a very popular city among Portuguese royalty. Aveiro is called “The Portuguese Venice”, because of its beautiful canals and traditional boats (moliceiros) that resembles the Italian city of Venice.

Some points of interest in or around the city may include:

- Rossio (city centre)
- Teatro Aveirense (city’s theatre)
- Mosteiro de Jesus or Museu de Santa Joana
- Fábrica Centro Ciência Viva (dynamical science center, managed by University of Aveiro )
- Sé de Aveiro (Cathedral of Aveiro)
- The old Train Station with the typical Portuguese tiles “azulejos”
- A ride on the board of the typical boats “moliceiros” in Ria.
- Pateira de Fermentelos (the biggest natural lagoon in the Iberian Peninsula)
- Natural Reserve of São Jacinto
- Beaches of Costa Nova and Barra

Created in 1973, the University of Aveiro (UA) quickly became one of the most innovative universities in Portugal. 

# TRANSPORTATION



## How will you get to Aveiro ?

### Flying to Portugal

The closest airport is Francisco Sá Carneiro International Airport in Porto, located at 70kms to the north of Aveiro. Portela International Airport in Lisbon is located 250kms to the south of Aveiro.

### From Porto Airport to Aveiro

First you have to go to Porto - Campanhã railway station. The best and cheapest way is to go by Metro. Take a Violet (E) Line, which has a terminal at the airport. The trip between the airport and the railway station takes about 32 minutes (Z4 zone) and costs 1,85 € (one way) + transportation card(andante) 0,50€ (you buy the card just one time). The train journey to Aveiro takes around 40 minutes by fast train and about 1hour by urban train. The price of one ticket by urban train is 3,40 € + transportation card (you buy the card just one time). Fast trains (Alfa pendular and Intercidades) cost more than urban train. ## **From Lisbon Airport to Aveiro**

The best way to get to Aveiro is by train from Lisboa-Oriente railway station. To get to the train station, take metro in the airport to Oriente (red line). You can also go by taxi, which takes about 10 minutes or by bus (lines 5 and 44). The train to Aveiro takes around 2-3 hours. 
## **How to reach the University of Aveiro from Aveiro Railway Station**

# Museums

## MUSEU SANTA JOANA PRINCESA (MUSEUM OF AVEIRO )

The Princess D. Joana gave her name to the museum. She was daughter of the King D. Afonso V, left all of wealth behind and entered this house in 1472, leading a saint life. In 1693 she was beatified. The Convent became famous mostly because of the presence of Princess Saint Joana and her religious cult. The Museum of Aveiro presents a visit circuit with two different parts that complement each other: the monumental route and the permanent exhibition. On the ground floor you can see the tomb of Princess Saint Joana and the Church of Jesus which is decorated with sumptuous golden woodwork along with Portuguese "azulejos". On the second floor you can find paints about how the Princess' became a nun. Tuesday to Sunday: 10:00 – 18:00 Closed on Mondays. Free entrance on Sundays and holidays till 14:00. For students always free.

Then the exhibition "CCAveiro" will take you on a journey through the history of the city region from its origins until the beginning of the 21th century. The expositions reflects the typical businesses of Aveiro such as fishing, salt production and ceramic industry. Sure, they didn't forget to mention about important people who has changed Aveiro's destiny. Also there is permanent exhibition on the last floor. Check it!

## MUSEU ARTE NOVA (NEW ART MUSEUM)

The Arte Nova Museum of Aveiro is an interpretation centre of the extensive network of Art Nouveau buildings and elements that can be found throughout the city. In the center of Aveiro you can find twenty eight buildings representing this style. You can recognize them if you pay attention to the marble sign in the floor in front of building.

“Fábrica” is a dynamical science center that belongs to the Portuguese net of the science centers. It aims to contribute to the development of the national scientific and technological culture. Its connection with the University of Aveiro is a focal point to achieve that goal. This science center stimulates the interest for knowledge and entertains by connecting science and technology with everyday life. Science exhibitions and a variety of scientific activities concerning chemistry, biology, physics and robotics are offered to the public.

## MARITIME MUSEUM OF ÍLHAVO

This museum is situated in Ílhavo; a small town very close to Aveiro (About 7 km from the university). The museum was and still is a witness of the strong relation between the people of Ílhavo and the sea and the Aveiro lagoon. The “Faina Maior” – cod fishing with lines and hooks in single man dories in Newfoundland and Greenland – as well as the agro-maritime activities are the patrimonial references of the museum. Each of the themes is present in a permanent exhibition offering the visitor the possibility to find traces of a recent past. In the seas room, the third permanent exhibition of the museum, one can find a varied selection of boat models that express the diversity of the Portuguese maritime patrimony and the strong relation between the local people and the sea.

### SANTO ANDRÉ :

After being an active cod-fishing ship for over half a century, the Santo André was permanently anchored on the docks of “Forte da Barra” (Gafanha da Nazaré, next to Barra) in 1997, due to the rising of restrictions for overseas fishing. The owner of the ship and the Gafanha autarchy decided to make this trawler a museum, so that everyone could see the cod-fishing methods and could understand the lives of those who served the ship. Currently, it was claimed by the Maritime Museum of Ílhavo as a side-museum.

If you buy the ticket for two expositions the Maritime museum and the Santo André boat, you can get a discount.  
You can use the bus from Aveiro to Barra beach.

## THE VISTA ALEGRE PORCELAIN FACTORY HISTORIC MUSEUM

In this museum you can learn the history of the famous Portuguese porcelain company created by José Ferreira Pinto Basto and also buy in the Factory Shop some precious pieces, some with a significant discount. This museum is situated in a beautiful typical villa close to Ílhavo, about 10 km from Aveiro.

## AVEIRO LAGOON



The Aveiro lagoon "Ria de Aveiro", is named after the city of Aveiro, which is the main urban centre located near to the lagoon. Ria de Aveiro is beyond a mere geographical feature of Portugal. This 45-kilometer-long lagoon stands as one of Europe's last remaining untouched coastal marshland. It is also a haven for numerous bird species. Tourism and aquaculture are the main activities of the Aveiro Lagoon region. "Moliceiros" provide access along the Ria for tourist visits, in addition to traditional fishing or recreational purposes, including regattas. It is also renowned for its artisan fishing and as a center for the collection of 'Flor de sal' (an expensive salt variety).

## ECOMUSEUM OF TRONCALHADA

Transformed into Eco-Museum, the Troncalhada Saltplant shows visitors the artisanal salt production methods, explores the landscape, flora and fauna characteristics as well as keeps alive the experiences and traditions linked to this secular activity.

Characterized for being an open-air museum, open permanently, it permits the visitor to make the visit independently by querying the various interpretative panels. Intending a better understanding you can request a tour accompanied by one of the technicians of the educational services of the Museum of the city [minimum 6 people]. Despite the seasonal nature of the production of traditional salt characteristic, the guided tours of this museum can be requested every year, being provided in interior space, if weather conditions are not favorable.

# Bird Watching



Aveiro has the largest wetland in the northern part of Portugal, being one of the most important hot spots for bird watching. Different birds species can be observed here all over the year, such as: Common Scoter, Marsh Harrier, Purple Heron, Little Bittern, Little Egret, White Stork, Black-winged Stilt, Grey Plover, Eurasian Golden Plover, Northern Lapwing, Kentish Plover, Common Redshank, Greenshank, Dunlin, Black-tailed Godwit, Common Kingfisher, Yellow Wagtail, Great Reed Warbler, Savi's Warbler, Common Reed Bunting, Cirl Bunting and The Greater Flamingo. It takes around 50 minutes and it costs 8 €. Observe the paintings on the boats, and ask your guide to translate what is written there. Some phrases have double meaning!

# São Jacinto



The natural reserve São Jacinto is located at the southernmost tip of the line of sand dunes separating the northern branch of Ria de Aveiro from the Atlantic Ocean. It is composed of sandy beaches, marshland, freshwater and saltwater, and is home of many valuable species. You are guaranteed an unforgettable visit. This protected area consists of three different and characteris-

tic zones, including a line of sand dunes, consolidated by spontaneous vegetation.

You can go from Aveiro to "Forte da Barra" by bus and take a ferry boat to reach Sao Jacinto.

The markets and traditional stores are closed Saturday afternoon and Sunday, while most of the supermarkets are opened also during the weekend.

## Aveiro Beaches

### Climate of Aveiro;

Aveiro has humid wet temperate climate, coolish in the summer and not so cold in winter. November, December, and January make up the rainy season, while July and August are the driest months. Autumn and Winter tend to have strong coastal winds, excellent for kite or wind-surf, as well as sailboat amazing conditions.
